- **Shin-rai** This word means to *trust*... to lean your whole weight on something (or someone).

Faith in all of its four aspects, comes as *gift* rather than as reward or merit. As Peter once put it (John 6:68)... "Lord, to Whom shall we Go?!! **YOU** have the words of eternal life."

Children and Sleep

Do your children have cell phones; do they play video games? These electronic devices have a sneaky way of interfering with sleep patterns. Recent studies have determined that a child receives their first cell phone is at age twelve. Children play video games at a much younger age; even preschoolers are adept at playing video games. As much fun as these devices provide, they may have a negative affect on children's sleep patterns.

A pediatric pulmonologist from Lehigh Health Network cited a study that determined that teens send an average of 34 text messages a night, which cuts into their sleep. Children with more that four electronic devices in their bedroom are twice as likely to fall asleep while doing school work, either in school or at home.

Electronic devices are not the only reason children and teens do not get enough sleep. School and after school activities make winding down at night difficult. Crankiness, irritability, snoring, and morning headaches are a few of the symptoms of an inadequate amount of sleep.

Stick to a pre-bedtime ritual, such as quiet time, reading, and a bath to ensure a better night's sleep for younger children. For adolescents and teens, encourage consistent sleep during the week as well as on the weekend.

Amount of Sleep Needed

Infants	14 – 15 hours
Toddlers (age $1 - 3$)	12 – 14 hours
Preschoolers	11 – 13 hours
School-age children	10 – 11 hours
Teens	8½ – 9½ hours

The Spirit of Northeastern Pennsylvania Synod, ELCA

Be Who You Are! See What You Have! DO WHAT MATTERS!

Northeastern Pennsylvania Synod congregations are discovering where God is on the move!

On four days in November, a total of 68 congregations participated in the follow-up to the first round of *Do What Matters* workshops. Led by Kelly Fryer and Tana Kjos of "A Renewal Enterprise," these workshops helped us open

ourselves to working in renewable ways in a world

that's changing more rapidly than we can imagine.



At the heart of a renewable approach are these three principles:

Be who you are. See what you have. *Do what matters*.

Participants in the workshops were given a congregational toolkit to help them look at who they are, what they have, and how they can do what matters. There are five parts to this toolkit:



1. A guide for reading the Book of Acts together (as a congregation council, church committee, or possibly as an entire congregation!)

- A fun way for people in congregations to practice paying attention to what God is up to in their everyday lives – at home, work, school.
- 3. An idea for getting congregational members to join in with what God is doing in the community and through their neighbors, and to

partner with other organizations to do what matters to God.



- 4. A challenge to STOP doing something in congregational life that has stopped being fun or effective something that is "sucking the life out of you."
- 5. A challenge exercise a suggestion of a new way of "doing business" letting God set the agenda for your congregation.

At the November events, congregations began working on these five tools and shared some of their hopes. The synod staff is digging into this, too. The entire staff has begun to study the Book of Acts together and staff meetings are devoted to sharing places where God is on the move. They are starting to look at places where they can partner with other organizations to do more effective ministry.

Week one: Go outside at night and look at the stars. Talk about how stars guided the wise men to see Jesus. How many stars can you see? Think about how big God's creation is.

Week two: Gather around a table and turn out all the lights in your house. Light one candle and talk about where you saw God this week.

Week three: Go outside and walk around your

neighborhood. Look for signs of God's creation in the air and on the land. Do you see any animals or plants?

What's all this about "Doing What Matters"?

Approximately a third of the congregations throughout the Lehigh Mission District and the whole synod have been involved in a process led by ARE (A Renewal Enterprise.) ARE encourages congregations to live out three key principles:

- Be who you are (*i.e.*, the people of God and the Body of Christ in that place—more than a social club, restaurant, or burial society.)
- Use what you have; don't focus on what you don't have or would like to have. God has already given you the resources to do what God wants you to do.
- Do what matters to God. There is always a multitude of possibilities for what a congregation could decide to do. So, when considering those options, choose to do what is important to God.

Another strong theme of ARE is that God is already working in the world to accomplish God's will. "God is on the loose" and the congregation's role is to figure out what God is already doing and how the congregation can partner with God to do what matters to God in your community. "God sightings" are occasions where we see the fruit of God's Spirit present in our world and in our lives—fruits such as love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, gentleness.

God speaks to us through the scriptures and the living Word, so it's essential that we spend time and energy dwelling in that word as community-praying and listening for God's voice. Congregations which have become involved in ARE report that they have experienced a reenergizing of their mission.

Beginning early in 2012 these LMD Newsletters will feature reports from congregations in our mission district which have been involved in the first round of this ARE effort. The changing times in which we live invite us to examine the nature of our ministry and encourage us to adjust our thoughts and our action patterns. Our predecessors in Christ's church were prepared to make the changes which were necessary to remain relevant to their day and who can challenge the fact that we have a responsibility to continue in this tradition.


